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| Fabric | Cutting Instructions |
| A -yellow (\#9020-52 yellow brick road) | $\diamond$ Cut (1) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 2 \prime$ piece (A1) and (2) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares (A2) |
| B -green (\#9020-721 lime twist) | $\diamond$ Cut (1) $43 / 4{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ piece (B) |
| C - cream (\#9020-111 champagne) | $\diamond$ Cut (1) $10^{\prime \prime} \times 6788^{\prime \prime}$ piece (C) |
| D - aqua background (\#9020-60 reflection) | $\diamond$ Cut (1) $83 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square $\square$ (D1), (1) $43 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square $\boxtimes(D 2)$, (1) $41 / 2 "$ square Z (D3), (2) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 15 /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ pieces (D4) and (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ squares (D5) |

Piecing: All seams are $1 / 4$ ". Press toward darker fabric unless indicated.
Tip for aligning patches for sewing: When you have 2 patches to be sewn together and they are sloped at opposite $45^{\circ}$ angles, they are correctly aligned when they meet at the $1 / 4 "$ seam line as shown at right.


When you have 2 patches to be sewn together and only one is sloped at a $45^{\circ}$ angle, they are correctly aligned when they meet $3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ from the edge as shown at right. However, sew them together with a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam.

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back of each $A 2$ square. Lay an A2 square face down on square corner of 2 D 2 triangles and sew along line; trim $1 / 4$ " beyond line and press seam toward $A$.

2. Sew the units from step 1 to long edges of A1 piece, aligning them at the same end. Press seams toward $A$ and trim end of A1 even with D2 edges.

3. Sew a D4 piece to short edges of $B$; press seams toward $B$.
4. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back of each D5 square. Lay each D5 square face down in adjacent corners of a short edge of $C$ and sew along line; trim $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ beyond line and press seam toward C.

5. Sew the B unit from step 3 to
 this edge, and press seam toward $B$ unit.
6. Center and sew the unit from step 2 to remaining edge of $B$ unit (use tip above); press seam toward B unit.

7. Lay a D1 triangle on each long edge of unit from step 6, aligning one end with the A unit (see tip above). Note that the C piece will extend beyond the end of D1. Pin in place and sew with D1 on the bottom to help ease it in (bias on bottom). Press seam toward $C$ and trim tips of $C$ even with edge of D1.
8. Center and sew a D3 triangle to remaining edge of $C$, sewing with $C$ on top. Press seam toward C and trim block to $12 \frac{1}{2}$ ".

Make 4 blocks and turn them into a darling wall quilt, perfect for a nursery!


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
