

## Feeding Time

Finished Size: 12" square (12%" edge-to-edge)

Skill level: Intermediate


Fabrics used: Toscana suede-look texture by Northcott

 $\square$  = cut once diagonally  $\square$  = cut twice diagonally

Fabric	Cutting Instructions
A –yellow (#9020-52 yellow brick road)	♦ Cut (1) 4" x 2" piece ( <b>A1</b> ) and (2) 1½" squares ( <b>A2</b> )
<b>B</b> –green (#9020-721 lime twist)	♦ Cut (1) 4¾" x 2¼" piece ( <b>B</b> )
<b>C</b> – cream (#9020-111 champagne)	♦ Cut (1) 10" x 6%" piece ( <b>C</b> )
D – aqua background (#9020-60	♦ Cut (1) 8¾" square ☑ ( <b>D1</b> ), (1) 4¾" square ☑ ( <b>D2</b> ), (1) 4½" square
reflection)	☑ (D3), (2) 2¾" x 1¾" pieces (D4) and (2) 1½" squares (D5)


**Piecing:** All seams are ¼". Press toward darker fabric unless indicated.

<u>Tip for aligning patches for sewing</u>: When you have 2 patches to be sewn together and they are sloped at opposite 45° angles, they are correctly aligned when they meet at the ½" seam line as shown at right.



When you have 2 patches to be sewn together and only one is sloped at a 45° angle, they are correctly aligned when they meet ¾" from the edge as shown at right. However, sew them together with a ¼" seam.

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back of each A2 square. Lay an A2 square face down on square corner of 2 D2 triangles and sew along line; trim ½" beyond line and press seam toward A.





**2.** Sew the units from step 1 to long edges of A1 piece, aligning them at the same end. Press seams toward A and trim end of A1 even with D2 edges.



**3.** Sew a D4 piece to short edges of B; press seams toward B.


**4.** Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back of each D5 square. Lay each D5 square face down in adjacent corners of a short edge of C and sew along line; trim ¼" beyond line and press seam toward C.





**5.** Sew the B unit from step 3 to this edge, and press seam toward B unit.

**6.** Center and sew the unit from step 2 to remaining edge of B unit (use tip above); press seam toward B unit.

7. Lay a D1 triangle on each long edge of unit from step 6, aligning one end with the A unit (see tip above). Note that the C piece will extend beyond the end of D1. Pin in place and sew with D1 on the bottom to help ease it in (bias on bottom). Press seam toward C and trim tips of C even with edge of D1.

**8.** Center and sew a D3 triangle to remaining edge of C, sewing with C on top. Press seam toward C and trim block to 12½".

Make 4 blocks and turn them into a darling wall quilt, perfect for a nursery!
